



Tips for students out of school

- Maintain a good balance of social, study and work life:
 - Try and keep weekly shifts to a minimum,
 it's not worth the impact on your education
- Try to have a hobby/ sport to break up revision time and help you unwind.
- Organisation is key



Tips for students in school

- Subjects are more intense at A-Level; make use of those study periods!
- Studying is important but so is your well being don't compromise your mental health
- Work out the optimum amount of time studying, and reward yourself after completing those revision session.
- People are here to help your teachers, Mr Fu, Mrs Greeney, parents, the leadership team, etc.

Reset your mindset about the timetable

- 50 hours of learning in a fortnight.
- Approx. 30 hours of lessons.
- 4 hours of Curriculum Enrichment
- 4-6 hours of SST (Supervised study)
- 10-12 hours of Independent Study Time.



16 hours of Supervised and Independent Study Time

Most subjects will expect about 3 hours of self-study/ homework each week. 6 hours outside of lessons each fortnight.

- Revision
- Research
- Reading
- Review

For most of Y12 that's 18 hours each fortnight...



- REVISION
- Plan ahead
- Don't wait till last minute
- Little and often rather than cramming
- Active Revision
 - Create flashcards (Quizlet);
 - Test & quiz yourself;
 - Create own quizzes (Blooket & Kahoot);
 - Exam Practice Questions; Essay/ Answer Plans.
 - Colour Revision Grids or Clock revision sheets





- RESEARCH
- Careful use of a RANGE of search terms or keywords
- Be patient and scan for the best SOURCE of information
- Not just the first search result
- Use Google Scholar- scan for similar works by the same writer
- Condense your results, not just copy and paste
- Evaluate your Best 10 facts, not the first





- READING
- Background reading is <u>essential</u> at KS5.
- Read AHEAD and set yourself up for success.
- It enhances your ability to access and progress in lessons.
- It allows a faster pace of lesson if the class has the core knowledge.
- A-Level lessons can then focus on the top end skills of analysis, evaluation, application etc.
- Read through a section at a time before starting to make notes so you can see the bigger picture before focusing on the details in your notes.





- **REVIEW**
- Go over your notes from a previous lesson to consolidate, check and review your learning.
- Go back over aspects of the lesson on Google Classroom.
- Can you do the <u>extension task</u> after the lesson?
- The morning or night before a lesson, review and remind yourself of what you did previously.
- It's like starting a lesson with a warm up, rather than a cold start.



Plan your time smartly

REWARDS

- Plan a REWARD for yourself
- Set yourself a SMART target
- E.g. 45 min to complete your notes
- Treat yourself to 10-15 minutes of "phone time"
- Or a hot chocolate from the Bistro!
- Or your favourite sitcom at home
