MUSIC CURRICULUM ROADMAP YEAR 7

The order of these projects may vary depending on available resources_

Scene Composition

Students are introduced to the key vocabulary used in Music and the model of Composition, Performance and Analysis used throughout KS3

Instruments of the Orchestra

Students explore orchestral timbres in the Young Persons Guide to the Orchestra and using Peter and the Wolf as a model create a piece of Programme Music.

Pitch and Notation

Students are introduced to formal stave notation, how it developed and how it is used as a universal language. They create and perform a piece of music which they notate.

Rhythm Round

Students look at the notation of duration. They look at common rhythmic patterns and create a compositon using formal notation.

Hero/ Villain Music

Students explore the theme music composed by John Williams and use this as the inspiration to create music for their own hero or villain.

Calypso Music

Students learn about this genre of music and its characteristics then develop their keyboard skills in a performance based task.
