The Gap Year Option



Gap Year

- Can be valuable on your CV
- Can enhance higher education subject study
- Give a break from study/ travel
- Opportunity to earn money/ work experience
- Reflect and consider future plans
- Opportunity to mature ready for next steps

... If it is well planned and executed



Gap Year

Consider the Pros and Cons

- A distraction from long term plans
- Can be harder to return to study or work after a break
- Can be expensive
- Can end up 'just thinking about it'
- But you can directly apply for 2022-23 UCAS entry in 2021 and have it planned. (£1-2 extra cost)

Apprenticeships

- Apprenticeships offer a real alternative to traditional university study
- Opportunity to move your career forward, gain professional skills, status and accreditation – all while earning a salary
- Provides a clear pathway to reach your career ambition in the workplace



Apprenticeships

Higher/Degree Apprenticeships

- Can result in higher earning capacity, recognition and professional status
- An increasing number of apprenticeships available
- These cover range different job roles, ranging from legal services to engineering
- Many with guaranteed permanent employment
- Leave with a degree and no debt

An example of a Higher Apprenticeship



- Minimum of 80 UCAS points required (CDD grades at A-level)
- Evidence of work experience desirable
- Audit, Finance, compliance, business leader, IT
- Professional Industry specific qualifications
- A range of work placements to give you the broadest skills and experience possible





An example of a Higher Apprenticeship

BBC

- TV & Radio Production
- Level 3 qualifications as a minimum
- Demonstrate active interest in the media
- 12.5k starting salary
- Opportunity for further qualifications



An example of a Degree Apprenticeship



- Minimum 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above
- 3 A level passes
- Business and Finance
- Rotation work placement before specialising
- Professional & Bachelors Degree qualifications
- circa 21.5k starting salary





An example of a Degree Apprenticeship



- Minimum entry 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above
- 2 or 3 A level passes B grade (subject specific dependant on role)
- Business, technology, Science, IT
- Rotation work placements before specialising
- Full bachelors Degree
- 15k starting Salary



University or Apprenticeship ??

You don't have to decide right away

- Consider your end goal
- Keep an eye on Apprenticeships early in Y13
- You can apply for both UCAS and Apprenticeships

The Application Process

Research courses

Attend open days

Submit a draft personal statement

Complete the application form including details of all qualifications

Submit the completed form so the tutor reference can be added



Some things to think about:

- What do you enjoy?
- Suitability of course for career path
- Location
- Extra curricular activities (clubs and societies)
- Study style (continual assessment or not)
- Graduate employment rates



Some more things to think about:

 Entry requirements Be ambitious but realistic! Use most likely grades to guide choices



- Application is online
- Five choices

- £26 fee
- Other Universities are unable to see what/ where else you have applied for.



Application form:

- Personal Details
- Choices
- Education
- Employment
- Personal Statement (4000 characters -47 lines)



Applying to UCAS: Offer types

- Unconditional (note the practice of this was frowned upon this year but still persists)
 You usually have to make them your first choice.
- Conditional (must meet certain grades)
- Dependent on interview (might have to show portfolio or do admissions test)
- Pre-Entry Assessments (LNAT, BMAT, UCAT)



- Online system called **Track** allows you to follow progress of application
- Choose a Firm choice (where you'll be placed if meet entry requirements)
- Insurance (lower conditions incase firm choice not met)

- ☐ Twice as many of our students go onto Russell group Universities compared to national.




Admissions Tests











Admissions Tests

A number of courses will require a specific admissions test, such as the BMAT for **Medicine/Dentistry**.

These test usually take place during October (often half term).

Please research courses/Unis and inform us if you will be required to do this test so that we can register you.



Early entry applications:

Applications to Oxford or Cambridge and/or medicine; veterinary science and dentistry must be submitted to UCAS no later than **15th October 2021.**



Early entry applications:

Medicine, veterinary and dentistry have 4 choices plus 1 other.

Oxford or Cambridge University applications can **choose only one** or the other.



Conservatoires:

- £26 plus audition fee.
- Can choose 6, different deadline dates.
- Very selective, performance more important than entry requirements.

Can apply for UCAS and Conservatoire.



For all other courses:

Student deadline for personal statements to tutors is <u>Friday 15th October 2021</u>

Our final deadline for UCAS applications is **Friday 26th November 2021**



Finances

Student Finance England - SFE

Tuition fees & Maintenance Loan = Student Debt

Tuition fees are maximum £9250 per year

These are paid upfront - not means tested - paid directly to University



Tuition Fees & Maintenance Loan = Student Repayment

Maintenance loan: depends on personal circumstances as well as where and when studying. Paid directly to student. (for 2021/22)

Can borrow up to:

- £7,987 if living at home
- £9,488 if away from home but not London
- £12,382 if away from home and studying in London



Student finance England - SFE

- Pay back through tax. 9% of earnings above £25k. Not paid after 30 years then is cleared.
- Scholarships & bursaries: don't need to be paid back. Apply directly to Uni for this, dependent on circumstances & abilities.
- Apply early!! Window usually open from January-May
